Lateral Flow Testing for Families

LFD tests continue for school staff twice a week. However, a recent change from the DfE is that households, childcare and support bubbles of children or members of staff in school can now order LFD tests for use by adults. To find out further information or order tests, click here.

What's going on in school...

Bubble Times

We continue to work hard minimising the Covid-19 risk here at Moss Lane; we have decided to continue with staggered start times due to this. It is essential that children arrive and depart promptly at their designated bubble times. We fully understand that some families are juggling similar timings at junior schools. However, there have been an increasing number of children arriving outside of their designated bubble times. If you arrive after your bubble time, please do not sneak your child in the open gate as another bubble is arriving. We politely ask you press the buzzer at the front gate once, and a member of staff will come and collect your child. If we feel the gate area is too busy, we may ask you to wait until the entrance is clear and the bubble has moved away. Thank you for your continued cooperation with this matter.

Medication at School

We wanted to remind you that we can only administer prescribed medicine to your child at school when four doses are required. E.g. three doses are given at home and one at school, usually given at lunchtime. The medicine should be in the original container with a prescription label clearly stating the child's name, medication name, date of issue, expiry date and dosage required. We request that you come to the office to complete a permission form detailing the dosage and frequency of medicine -Medicines cannot be handed into class or via the child. An adult should deposit and collect these medicines each day as we cannot give them back to your child.

Children's Paracetamol

We do hold some children's paracetamol in school which can be administered in an emergency. We will always ring you to obtain permission before administering it. We are unable to give Ibuprofen to children in school unless it is prescribed.

Asthma & Inhalers

If your child suffers from asthma and requires an inhaler during the day, please ensure you bring the inhaler and spacer (if required) to the school office. Once again, this must be in the original named prescription packaging. We apologise but we cannot accept an inhaler without the prescribed named packaging. We will ask you to complete a form detailing your child's requirements and then the inhaler will be sent to the child's class where it will be readily available for use. Inhalers are sent home every term for cleaning and we ask you to provide new inhalers if they expire. Once again, these must be received and logged through the office when your child returns to school.


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
