What's going on in school...

Police Visits

Last week we were delighted to welcome our local community support officers James and Kim back to school. They had great fun speaking to all the children at lunchtime and we are pleased that they will be visiting Moss Lane on a regular basis.

Worry Monster



During the KS1 assembly this week, I talked to the children about what to do and who the children could speak to speak if they ever feel worried or upset. I introduced our new special letter box and worry monster that is situated on the table outside the school office. If any children have a concern or worry they can post it into the red-letter box and Miss Clare will monitor this on a weekly basis and offer children support and help when needed.

Rehearsal of alarms

In all childcare settings, rehearsal of fire and intruder alarms has to take place as part of health and safety and safe guarding practices. A "fire alarm" involves a continuous ringing of a bell to alert staff that they need to get the children out of the building safely but very quickly due to a fire risk. Children are led out the building and line up in the playground, where staff complete a head count to ensure all are accounted for. An "intruder alarm" is an intermittent bell that is rung to alert staff that children (and staff) must 'run and hide' due to a danger inside or outside the building. Staff tell children "there is a danger outside, hide." Children are supported by familiar adults to hide behind chairs or under tables. Children are asked to be silent and remain hidden until the area is safe. Whilst this experience can be daunting for some children, it is essential that it takes place. Children have experienced both a fire alarm and an intruder alarm practice in the last two weeks. We are proud of how the children have responded to these new experiences.

Harvest Festival

Rehearsals have been going well for our Harvest Festival. Performances will take place on 20^{th} October at 09.15 (all years) and 14.15 (Y1 and Y2 only). *

REMINDERS....

Late arrivals and holiday

A polite reminder that our doors open at 8.45am each morning. The register is taken at 8.57am and learning begins. Children arriving after 8.57am are classed as late and they miss valuable learning time. We understand that on rare occasions, things happen and the morning runs late. However, this should not be a regular occurrence. Please make every effort to have children in school on time ready for a great day.

At Moss Lane we have an Attendance 'Hero' system, which stands for:

- Here
- Everyday
- Ready
- On time

Could I once again remind parents I **do not** authorise Special Leave of Absences unless the request meets the exceptional circumstances criteria. There will also be penalty fines incurred for unauthorised special leave of absences for five or more days in line with our Attendance Policy - £60 per child per parent/carer. These will be issued by the Local Authority.

As travel restrictions may continue to ease, **please can I ask that holidays are only taken in holiday time, not in term time.** Our children have already had significant interruptions to their learning over the past 18 months and therefore should not be taken out of school for an additional holiday or a day out.
