Meanwhile the Headteachers, within the GLP, have worked out a development and training programme to benefit all staff from the GLP schools. Schools have also set up professional working partnerships, with two or three other schools, to discuss approaches to different aspects of the curriculum, to exchange ideas and to share good practice with one another for the benefit of all our children.
