Summary of pupil premium funding 2016-17
<p>Objectives of spending Pupil Premium are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To ensure all disadvantaged groups of children make expected or better than expected progress. • To provide a home school link worker. • To provide targeted support to individual children to ensure they can access their learning. • To provide targeted support in Maths and Literacy and to secure improvement in achievement for disadvantaged children in these areas. • To ensure that all disadvantaged children are given opportunities to be involved in all enrichment activities (e.g. swimming, school trips, and breakfast club).

HSLW reports pupils have successfully transitioned into their new schools. • Support with school applications due to a lack of online facilities at home, this enabled one parent to complete a job application and get a job. • Parental support for a child being integrated into main stream school after being excluded 13 times in previous school and being taught at a SEARCH nurture group, child has now successfully integrated into full time education, forging positive friendships. • Average attendance for all PPG pupils 85.47 %. • 80 % pupils above 90% attendance & 20% less than 90%.

Trip subsidy	Children able to learn, opportunities for new learning experiences provided	£200	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All PPG pupils had school trips paid for plus an additional Rotary Club day trip. • At school PTA fairs pupils received free vouchers to take part in paid activities. 10/12 PPG families attended school event an increase from 4/12 families. This ensured families were able to take part in school activities and were not prevented due to economic reasons.

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 75% of swimming cost was paid for by PPG funding. • Swimming costume and towel purchased for one family to enable participation in lessons and learning and important life skill.
Club subsidy	Children able to learn, opportunities for new learning experiences provided	£300	<p>All PPG families received letters with the offer of having a paid after school club e.g. football club, gymnastics & Judo.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 50% pupils took up the offer of a paid after school club.
Additional resources	To provide additional resources to enhance literacy, maths, emotional and social skills. Additional teacher time in marking Pupil Premium books first and making sure they are feedback to each day put them as a priority in the classroom.	£300	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily milk funded, ensuring children receive nutritional benefit. • School uniform and trainers provided for one family, ensuring child is appropriately clothed for school. • Social story packs purchased to support children with social and emotional difficulties. • ADHD and ASC children's story books purchased to support a child with a ASC diagnoses.

With an overall reduction of undesired behaviour and no exclusions.• Attendance for 80% of pupils was in line with national average.• A good level of achievement in reading.
Outcome Developments
