Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)



Schools can receive additional funding for pupils whose parents are in receipt of income-related benefits (including Income Support, Child Tax credits (so long as you don't also receive working tax credit), or income based Jobseekers Allowance). For any pupil entitled to Pupil Premium, the additional funding means that we are able to provide extra support in many ways, examples being extra learning support or to fund a place at an after-school activity club. If you think your child might be eligible for Pupil Premium, please contact the School Office who will respect

and deal with any enquiries in total confidence. Finding out if your child qualifies for Pupil Premium is a really straight forward and discrete process; we check online and only require the parent's surname, date of birth and national insurance number, you do not have to bring in proof of benefits any-more. Any pupil whose parent/s are employed by the Armed Forces are also entitled to additional funding (Services Personnel Pupil Premium) - do let us know if this is relates to your child.

Amendments to Parking Enforcement in Guildford & Waverley



YOU COULD ENDANGER A CHILD'S LIFE

Until now, Guildford Borough Councils (GBC) enforcement officers in Guildford & Waverley have only issued a penalty charge notice (PCN) to vehicles which park illegally and have not moved when advised or if the motorist is not around. GBC enforcement officers can now issue a PCN if the motorist drives off before a ticket is issued. In this instance, the driver will get their notice through the post, even if an enforcement officer has only started writing out the PCN. Although GBC still intend to encourage motorists to move on, by adopting this practice

it's aim is to provide a stronger deterrent to motorists who park illegally with the expectation that they can avoid a penalty by moving their vehicles as soon as they see enforcement being carried out. This in turn should make the environment safer around our schools, particularly for children.
