




Bears Home Learning Week Beginning 8.6.2020

Introduce the idea of what symmetrical means – finger print with paint on one half of the paper, fold it in half, press down and open. Talk about how each side of the paper now looks the same.	Watch The Very Hungry Caterpillar video here or read the story if you have the book.	Finger paint The Very Hungry Caterpillar 	Can you use a computer or tablet to find out 3 caterpillar facts?	Roll a strip of paper tightly around a pencil to create a snail shell. 
Can you create a symmetrical butterfly – make sure both sides look the same.	Can you retell the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar and remember in what order the foods come?	Can you make a caterpillar out of an egg box or similar. 	Write down or type your 3 caterpillar facts.	Go on a butterfly hunt – how many butterflies can you spot?
Introduce the concept of halving... sharing equally between 2. Using 2 plates, share some food equally between the plates. 'One for you, one for me...'	Plan your own Hungry Caterpillar story changing what food he would eat each day. Write down or draw the plan for your new story on a piece of paper.	Make a Very Hungry Caterpillar paper chain. 	Research the lifecycle of a butterfly. (An example is here)	Can you create a butterfly dance?
Can you share some raisins/sweets/crisps between you and a teddy bear friend? Make sure you both have the same amount.	Retell your new Caterpillar story to your grown up using your plan to help you.	Create a collage of a piece of food from the book using magazines, newspapers or brochures.	Create a poster for the lifecycle of a butterfly.	Can you wriggle across the floor like a caterpillar without using your hands or feet?
Can you find: Half of 2 Half of 4 Half of 6 Half of 8 Half of 10	Create a book of your new story.	Create a symmetrical butterfly out of loose parts (e.g. buttons, coins, lego)	Healthy Eating sorting game here .	Draw a piece of food that the caterpillar eats.
