Play a dice game – roll a dice and double the number.	Reread the story again from yesterday. Write some sentences using the tricky word 'said' to recap what each animal says and the sound they make.	Choose a farm animal from the story and make a paper plate mask for that animal.	Research the life cycle of a lady bird and then draw some pictures yourself to show how ladybirds grow.	Try extra hard to use your knife and fork correctly for each meal you eat at home this week.
Talk about what half means.  Make some ladybirds paper cakes and cut them in half.	The ladybird decides to write a letter to the animals telling them what she has heard. Write a letter to the animals. Use go go green and uh-oh orange to mark your work at the end.	Sing the song Old McDonald had a farm with your family and add in some new and funny animals.	Create a fact file about one of the animals in the story.	Have a go at learning how to tie shoe laces.
Talk about how we find half of a number. Draw some ladybirds with the same number of dots on each wing. Cut them in half and talk about how many dots are on one half of the ladybird.	Today you can publish your letter, making it even better by changing all the things that were orange from yesterday.	Make a ladybird out of any bits and bobs you have at home.	Watch this clip about ladybirds and tell someone 5 things you found out.	Go on a scoot or a bike ride for at least half an hour.
