- It is good for children to socialise with other children.



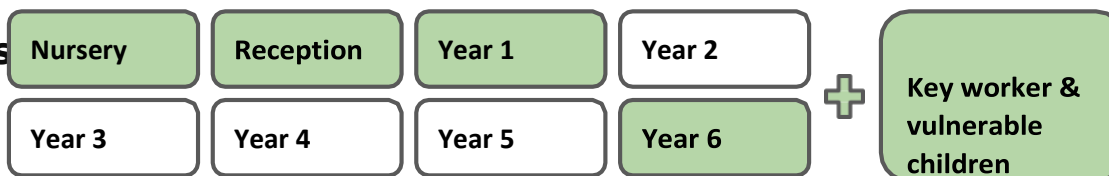
- School is the best place for them to learn.

What has changed?

Government says children from the year groups below can go back to school.



June 1st



**From June 3rd at Moss Lane we will welcome back children from Reception.
School will still be open for critical key workers' children and vulnerable children.**



What about their brothers and sisters?



- **Only children in the year groups above.**
- **Children in years 2 - 5 need to stay at home.**
- **They continue with the home learning .**

Home learning for those will are not at school.

- **This will still continue as before.**
- **Class teachers will link it to the learning that is happening in the school.**
- **Teachers will still continue with their weekly zoom calls.**
- **Children can still share the work that they have been doing with their class teacher.**
- **Parents' can use many of the online resources we have sent out e.g. Oak Academy , BBC Bitesize etc .**
- **Parents' to be mindful that all staff are teaching in bubble from 8.45am-3.30pm.**



How are you making sure that school is safe?



- We will check for risks before school is open.



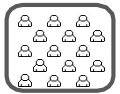
- Everyone will wash their hands regularly.



- If a child or family member is sick they cannot come to school



- School will be cleaned regularly.



- There will be less children in a room together.



- To do this we will need to make changes to the school day.



Does my child have to come to school ?



- **If your child is well and in one of the groups asked to attend they should.**



- **There will be no fines if your child does not go to school.**



Will my child be tested ?

Yes, if your child shows symptoms of Coronavirus they will be able to be tested.

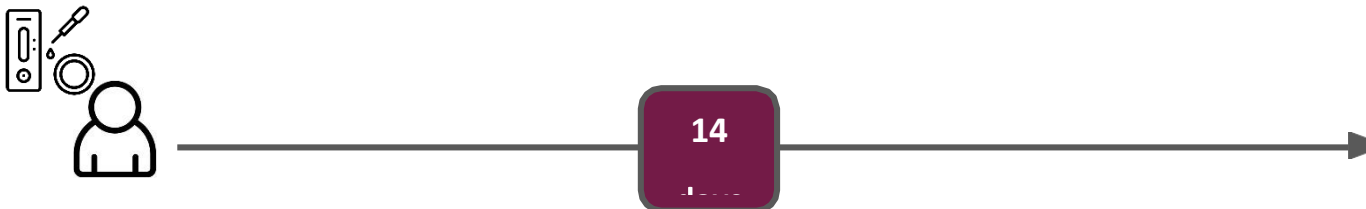
What if there is a case of coronavirus in school?



The person with symptoms must self-isolate for 7 days



The people they live with must self-isolate for 14 days.



If anyone at school tests positive, the whole class must self-isolate for 14 days.



What else might change?



- The time you drop off and pick up your child.

- They may not have all their normal lessons.
