

- Hanging up their own coat on their peg
- Knowing how to put on their own coat

Summer Jobs


Self care: wiping noses and hand washing, dressing/undressing, toileting/bottom wiping.

Teach to put things away when finished. At school we say 'Choose it, use it, put it away!'

Continue with fine motor skills e.g. drawing, Lego, threading, play dough, knife and fork etc.

Morning Routine

- 8.45am doors open may be message on class board
- Encourage your child to hang up their own coat, put away book bag and water bottle.
- Help them to find their name card.
- Pass on any information to staff (before the bell please!)
- Share a book with your child or investigate both classrooms.
- 8.57 a hand bell rings, children on carpet and parents go.

End of the Day Routine

- Please wait on the area of playground nearest to your child's class.
- Please do not be tempted to wait under the sheltered area as this makes it difficult for children to see their adults.
- Once we see you looking, we will call and send your child.
- Rushers PLEASE SEND BACK!
- Should you need to speak to the teachers or collect forgotten belongings, please wait until the end when all children have been dismissed.
