Results from Last Year's Yr 2 class

We are pleased to share with families the results from last year's Y2 SATs and teacher assessments (summer 2018), which have now been analysed. The results show that we have continued our improving trend for good levels of attainment. When measured against all schools nationally, and against the local authority, children at Moss Lane have achieved very well, surpassing the national and local authority averages. In the Y1 phonics screening Moss Lane children achieved 87% this is higher than the local authority at 84% and national at 83%

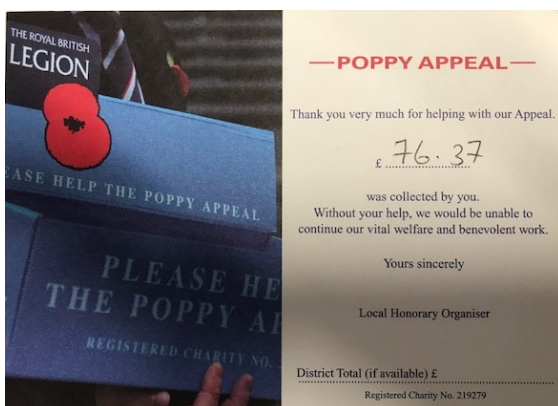
Harvest

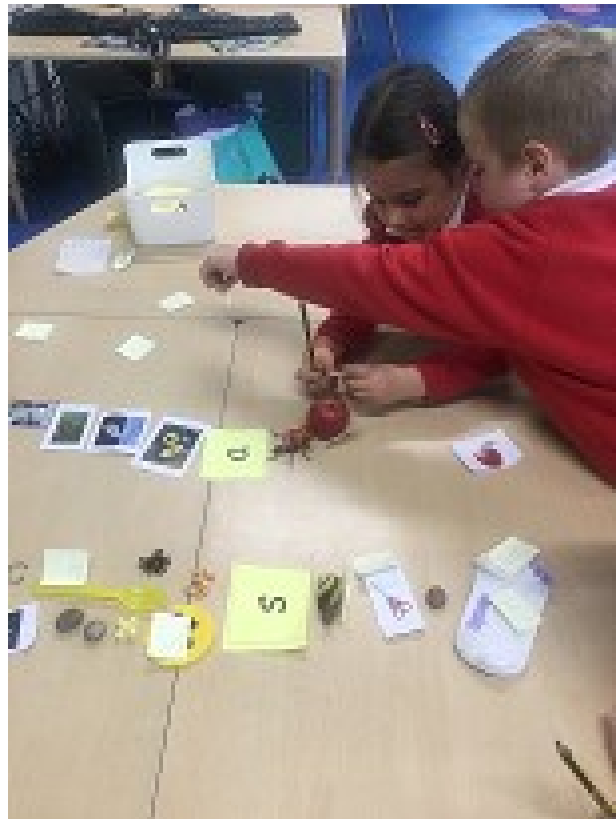


Learning at Moss Lane...

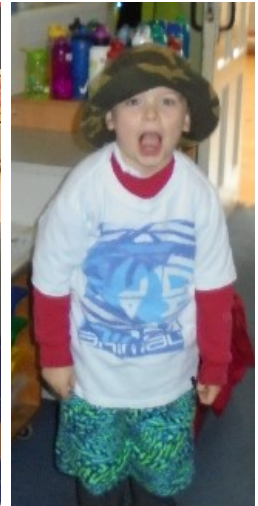
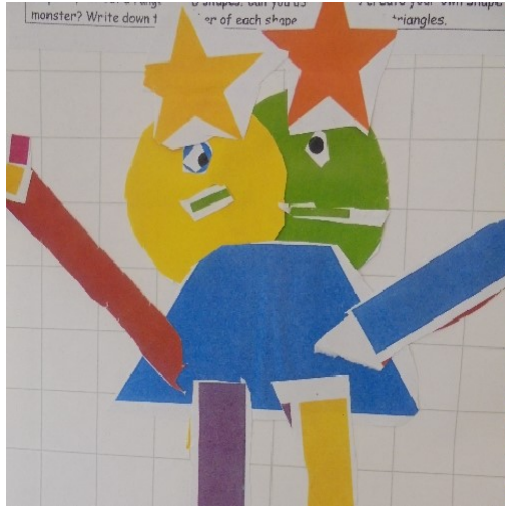
