

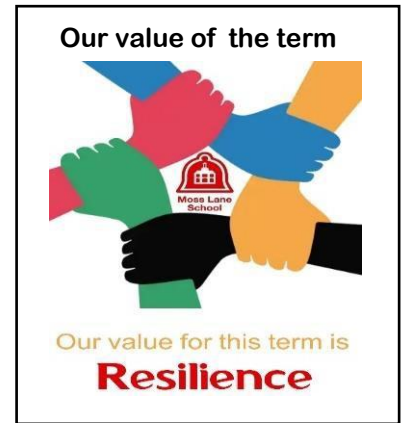

### **Yr 2 Assessment 2026**

This term, Year 2 children will be completing their optional National SATs tests. The children will be assessed in reading, writing, maths, spelling, punctuation and grammar. These tests provide a snapshot of each child's attainment and support Year 2 teachers in forming a secure final *teacher assessment* at the end of Key Stage 1. Key Stage 1 SATs take place in May, and although these tests are no longer compulsory, we will continue to use them at Moss Lane. We keep the process very low-key so that the children remain relaxed and confident. We do not tell the children when they will be completing their SATs, as we aim for the days to feel like a normal part of school life. The SATs outcomes will be used alongside teachers' own assessments to form the end-of-year judgement, which will be shared with parents in the annual reports.

Please can we ask all parents of Year 2 children to ensure that, where possible, they attend school every day this term.

### **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check (Year 1 pupils)**

Children in Year 1 will take a phonics screening check in June. This assessment consists of a series of real and 'nonsense' words, which children are asked to read using their phonics knowledge.

If a child does not achieve the required score, they will have the opportunity to retake the check in Year 2.

All schools are required to administer the phonics screening check to Year 1 pupils. In 2026, the check will take place during the week beginning Monday 9th June.

## Year 2

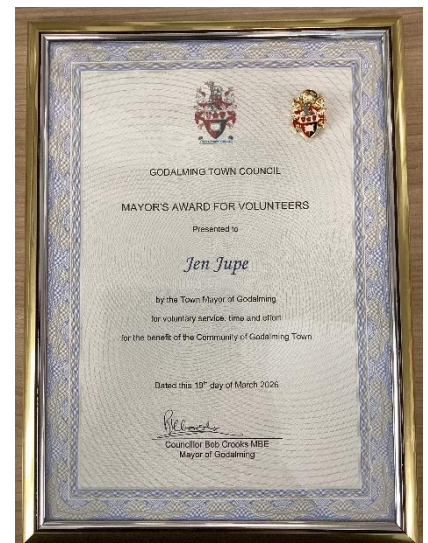

### **Parent Clinics...**

### **Summer is coming!**



Despite the sunshine, there has still been a cold wind, so please continue to send your child in with a coat. As the weather gets warmer, please also ensure your child has a named sun hat. On hot days, we ask that you apply sun cream at home in the morning before your child comes to school. Please do not send sun cream into school. We have shaded areas on the playground where we encourage children to play during hotter weather.

If you are buying summer shoes or sandals for your child, please choose closed-toe styles rather than open ones.

### **Safeguarding... NSPCC's Underwear Rule**

Ongoing as part of our PHSE curriculum all children discuss the NSPCC's Underwear Rule in the classes at school. During these discussions we aim to teach our pupils the following important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. We teach our pupils the NSPCC's Underwear Rule, using the 'PANTS' acrostic which is like a green cross code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for:

- **P**rivates are private
- **A**lways remember your body belongs to you
- **N**o means no
- **T**alk about secrets that upset you
- **S**peak up, someone can help

Lessons introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that is fully age-appropriate. These include: -

- "Appropriate" and "inappropriate" touching
- Your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable
- Naming parts of the body

### **Summer Reading Challenge 2026**

Summer Reading Challenge is being launched in Surrey Libraries on Saturday 4th July and runs until September. Developed by The Reading Agency and delivered by libraries, this annual event for 4-11-year-olds is designed to keep children reading during the summer.

Children's reading can 'dip' during the long summer holidays if they do not have regular access to books and encouragement to read for pleasure and this can be a problem for schools to put right in the new term. The Reading Agency's annual Summer Reading Challenge really helps by getting over 600,000 children regularly into libraries over the summer, with thousands more taking part online.

The Summer Reading Challenge 2026 theme is 'Read to the Beat'. The theme celebrates music, sound, and literature, encouraging participants to read six books, earn rewards, and boost literacy over summer break. Children have to be a library member to take part, but participation is completely free, and they can collect special stickers and rewards including a certificate. The aim is to read up to six books, and children can read whatever they like from Surrey Libraries' excellent range, including eBooks and eAudiobooks!



### **Appointments...**

Wherever possible, appointments such as dental, medical, opticians should be booked outside of school hours or during the school holidays. If your child must have a medical or dental appointment in school time, please try and make it after 2pm so your child can have their registration mark for the afternoon. If it needs to be in the morning, please try and bring them to school first to get their registration mark and return them to school afterwards. ### **Sickness absence reporting...**

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please call the school office before the start of the school day and leave a message with your child's name, class and details of illness. It is important that you provide information on why your child is ill in case we need to notify parents of vulnerable children or staff, for example in the case of chicken pox or measles.



### **Reception Morning Challenges**

Remember that parents/carers/grandparents can still sign up to come and help with Morning Challenges from 8.45am-9.45am each day in both Reception classes. If you haven't had a chance to come yet, or would like to help again, please sign up on the clipboards which live outside each classroom. It is so helpful to the class teachers to have a parent helper each day and we are really grateful for your support.
