They have also enjoyed playing games, reading stories, building with Lego and creating with playdough.

Mobile Parents/carers

While we would prefer parents/carers not to use their mobile phones while at school, we recognise that this would be impossible to regulate and that many parents see their phones as essential means of communication at all times. We would really appreciate it if parents and carers would refrain from using FaceTime or any form of video calling whilst on site as this is a safeguarding issue potentially for other members of our school community.
